On April 17, 2024, Family Promise of Warren County (FPWC) celebrated our Ribbon Tying. It was a great day where our supporters and the community at large came together to enjoy our new beginning at our new campus.

On April 21, 2024, we welcomed 3 families to our new campus. I don't think that I will ever forget the absolute joy on the faces of the families as they entered their rooms. Rooms that were sponsored and renovated by loving volunteers from a variety of congregations, businesses, neighborhoods, and organizations with the common goal to assure that these were places of dignity and love. A home in the midst of the crisis of homelessness.

And here we are one year later. Hard to believe as it has gone so fast! What a difference a year makes! Our volunteers once again adjusted to a "new normal." They brought in or cooked wonderful meals in our kitchen. They had plenty of space to do lots of fun things. We had water balloon fights and pools to cool off in. We enjoyed tag, Gaga ball, and playground fun. We did chalk drawings and bikes and frisbees. We had

pumpkin carving and paper crafts. We had normalcy as our volunteers gave our kiddos that opportunity to be the children that they are and to not think of their situation. AND our volunteers got to sleep in REAL beds with their own bathrooms!!

Our families learned about

vegetable gardens and that tomatoes don't come from Aldi! The OSU Master Gardeners, the Town and Country Gardeners along with Tom Ludeke and many volunteers made phase one of our Storybook Garden Path a reality. This program will look at limited expansion this year as we look towards the future when one day there will be a path around these gardens in which there will be pages of a book to read and a pleasant place to walk, ride bikes and be interactive with the world around us.

It has been a year of success and hope, and dreams coming true. A year of hard work. A year of fulfillment. A year of learning about our building. A year of making sure that pipes don't burst (we had one!), of being safe in weather emergencies (yes, we had our first tornado warning in our first week!), a year of meeting wonderful new potential volunteers, working with seasoned volunteers and a year of working towards expansion.

As we enter our 27th year of service and our 2nd year of service at our new campus, we also enter a year of potential financial concern. While the Office of Management and Budget

has temporarily rescinded the freeze on all federal assistance programs, the concern still exists that some or all of our federal funding will be removed or significantly cut back. As of this writing, there continues to be confusion and uncertainty. One thing is certain, loss of our federal and state funding will significantly negatively impact our organization as well as other non-profits.

In 2024, FPWC provided assistance of some nature to 2,432 callers. The needs were from those who are at risk of becoming homeless (many of which we were able to prevent through federal grants), in the crisis of homelessness or in need of other much-needed services. This number represents the highest number of referrals in our existence. We expect this number to grow in 2025 as the federal landscape changes.

If funding changes significantly across the board, homelessness will increase. Family Promise of Warren County MUST stay relevant in order to address this change. YOU are needed more than ever.

The good news is that FPWC has always been a good steward of all funds. We are currently in a good financial position.

FPWC will hold three fundraisers this year. Golf fore Home is to be held on May 19 at Heatherwoode Country Club in Springboro. We are excited to provide this fun event for our golf-minded supporters at this beautiful location. In addition to the shot gun scramble there will be challenges such as "closest to the pin," "longest putt" and "longest drive" not to mention fun raffles and a great breakfast, provided by Heather's in Springboro, and lunch.

On July 4 we are holding our 19th annual Run4Home 5K and Kid's Fun Run. This fun event provides support for the programs of Family Promise of Warren County. Make sure that you take a few moments to enjoy "the best after run snacks in all of Warren County"! Medals are given for all the children as well as the adults who place overall first and second as well as first and second in their age group.

This year we are introducing Tailgate For Home on October 5 at the Manor House. Wear the t-shirt of your favorite team and arrive in your favorite jeans ready to enjoy a cornhole tournament, football toss, the Sunday game of the week on big screen TV's, raffles, wine and bourbon pulls and more! Tailgate food will be the meal of the day and don't forget to bring decorations for your table as you will want to be the winner of the best table contest!

Your support of these fundraisers, either as a participant or a sponsor, will help FPWC to mitigate any future funding issues that may arise. We look forward to seeing you!

I end with this....it is because of YOU that Family Promise of Warren County is a leader in providing for families who are experiencing homelessness. I had just lost my apartment in summer of 2023. So I had no choice but to move in with my parents. I wanted to be able to move out and save my money. I was getting a little worried when I couldn't find a place because everything was so expensive at the time and my credit was not good. I was living with my parents for a good year when I gave Metropolitan Housing a call asking about a housing voucher. They were on a wait at the time so they told me about Family Promise of Warren County (FPWC).

When I heard about what FPWC could offer for a few months I jumped at the opportunity. The workers there were so nice and understanding of the whole situation and were glad to take us in!

FPWC gave me and my

daughter our own space and fed us every night. We stayed in room 11 and we loved it! So cute! Felt like I was staying at the beach house with how it was decorated! My child loved playing on the playground and in the playroom with the other kids after dinner. She loved helping out and cleaning!

The workers there were kind and encouraging through the whole process. I loved my case manager! She was the absolute nicest woman ever! Always checking in and making sure you are doing okay! FPWC encouraged us to save every penny so that we could be out on our own. They made sure we enjoyed our nights with games and we left with friendships. They made sure we were learning about what it is like to be financially stable and to have our own place in the future.



The church volunteers were so supportive and kind to me and my little girl. She LOVED every church volunteer that came through that door every night! They made sure she was loved! I couldn't be more grateful for them! My daughter enjoyed being

around them and having other kids to play with every night. I would say FPWC was the best thing to happen to us. They really do care and want what's best for your future! FPWC will do anything they can to help you with whatever it is that you need help with.

If your thinking about taking a leap of faith but are scared and worried don't be! I was just like you when I came to take a tour! Once you take that tour I promise you will see things so differently! I know I did! And we're so thankful for them for taking a chance on us and us taking a chance on them! Being in a homeless shelter at FPWC is nothing like other people make it out to be. FPWC helps you grow and learn along the way!

I moved into my apartment in

December of 2024. I was one of the lucky ones that got the apartments in South Lebanon only because this complex didn't have a waitlist so you had to call everyday to see what was available. My case manager was so excited for me! She couldn't believe it! I was with FPWC for about 3 months when I got this apartment. I was scared and excited at the same time! Starting over is not easy but it's progress. My daughter is always wanting to come home because she loves it so much! She has her own room and a playroom! We have so much space and I'm so blessed that we have a forever home.

Sunrise Landing is a community on Montgomery Road and we live on Sandharbor Court, a street with 60 condo units. Most of us are retired and we can be found on the lake, at the pools, on the pickleball court, going out to lunch or dinner, doing yoga or water aerobics. We stay busy but some of us were looking for something more...something with purpose and meaning.

We heard about FPWC from another neighbor, Mr. Jim Mohr. He has loved FPWC for years and speaks highly of the wonderful work they do. So, we found a few people who wanted to learn more....and I mean ...a few. Three of us went to a volunteer training and then invited others who might be interested. There were 5 of us at the gathering, and there were a few others who would contribute but were not interested in hands on involvement. So, we signed

on for our first dinner. The menu was simple, sloppy joes and buns, veggie trays, homemade cookies, and drinks. Easy!! We arrived and we were eager to set up and meet our guests. We were so nervous. Then....they arrived! We told them this was our first time. We were not sure of the routine. We asked for their assistance and patience with us. Well they probably took one look at this rag-tag group and realized "Oh, they're kinda old and they remind me of my gramma." And we became the Sandharbor Grannies....even though we have a few gentlemen involved too. We had a great time.

The moms took over the set up, serving the kids, cleaning up the kitchen. We hung out with the kids, sang some songs, did some coloring. On a personal note. This day had been marked on my calendar for the past 10 years as Diagnosis Day, the day my husband received a diagnosis of Stage IV lung cancer with metastases to the

brain, and he died 30 days later. He was a pastor and we were a team, using our gift of music in worship and ministry. Well, one of our volunteers brought a guitar (my husband played guitar). One of the kids has a hearing impairment and was completely fascinated by the guitar, holding it and feeling the vibrations. What a joy to see his beautiful little face as he touched the strings! It was a Holy Moment, and it completely changed the somber remembrance of this day. Thank You, Family Promise of Warren County, for that gift.

We signed up for more dinners. We have people who contribute financially so our next meal will be fried chicken, mashed potatoes, and of course, homemade cookies. We are still a small but mighty group of neighbors who look forward to doing what we can to make a difference in the lives of others as well as in our own hearts and lives.
