has remained a wise, dependable, and prayerful member of the Board of Directors for more than 25 years, holding many positions on the Board as well as volunteering his time at Lebanon United Methodist Church. He loved spending time with the families, and I think that his heart broke a little with each child that experienced homelessness. And with that, there



was no one more joyful than David when a family achieved housing and self-sufficiency. I dare say the success of Family Promise of Warren County is largely due to David's strong faith and wise guidance. We have indeed been very blessed to have David at the helm.

David is experiencing a decline in his health due to a genetic neuromuscular disease which will prevent him from continuing as a volunteer for Family Promise of Warren County. While his absence will be greatly missed, be assured that the status of Family Promise of Warren County remains strong, and the current Board of Directors also remain dedicated to the mission "To assist families experiencing homelessness

in Warren County, Ohio, to achieve sustainable independence through community-based response."

I know that David would ask for your continued prayerful support of Family Promise of Warren County and all the families that we are blessed to serve. And I ask your prayerful support of David and his family as they navigate this health challenge.

Well, at Family Promise of Warren County the time has come. After nearly two years of planning, the new FPWC Campus is ready!

The staff is in the process of the finishing touches of packing. The move will be before the end of 2023 and in early 2024 families in Warren County who are in the crisis of homelessness will begin to move into our new home and find the support and success that they work towards so as to never be homeless again.

Our family rooms have been lovingly renovated with insights into how they would want their loved one in this situation to live. To all those who have renovated family rooms, I cannot thank you enough. But the thanks does not end here...

Folks like the Scholl Family

Foundation supplied furniture to make our Gathering Room a room of warmth and love. The Lebanon United Methodist team with the support of the McGinty Family renovated the nursery, designed a playroom for our kiddos and created a computer room where adults will look for employment, work on GED and locate housing. This room will also be a place where school age children can successfully do their homework with access to the internet.

Our kitchen is newly remodeled with up to date appliances. This could not have been done without the funding through Miami Valley Gaming and the work and time from Doyle Key and Marvin Hartsfield to put in place an island as well as meal seating. This indeed will be a place where families and volunteers alike can enjoy fellowship while creating meals and memories.

And it doesn't stop there.

IKEA provided a training kitchen, training room and dignified waiting space for families. Families will participate in classes like Parenting, Landlord/Tenant, Financial Security and where children can learn American Sign Language. This area will also provide a space where

And, we are so honored to be the recipient of funds from the Love Like JJ organization that has provided a Gaga pit, outdoor seating, a giving library and toy storage for our families to enjoyed. We appreciate their kind support in renovating the Family ADA room for families that join us with mobility issues.

This new facility will indeed provide an oasis for those in our community who face the crisis of homelessness. With the support of the staff, those who are homeless will realize their worth, their abilities and see success in their future. They

will have the tools to NEVER be homeless again. They will have been treated with love and comfort by caring volunteers who adhere to what the Bible has taught us - "love one another".

Yes, the time has come, the time is now...we will indeed GO, GO, GO with new leadership, new volunteers and new goals.

My family consists of three kids, my boyfriend, his daughter and me. We met after my husband and I split up. I had been on a downward slope of losing everything until I met Will. Due to the split with my ex, my kids and I had nowhere to go. We ended up staying at my boyfriend's mom's temporarily.

Unfortunately, the environment was not good for my family so we made the decision to leave. We were going to be homeless. I reached out to everyone I knew but no one could help us.

We had literally lost all hope until I finally found Family Promise of Warren County. They are wonders; they helped us get out of our downward slope of a life that didn't seem to be going anywhere. They provided us shelter until we got a place of our own. They even assisted us financially to be able to move in.

The case workers there are amazing! I have never met people so caring to help people in our

position. The church volunteers fed us and made us feel like family. They gave us the hope we needed in our life to keep going.

I couldn't express the gratitude in my heart that I have for everyone who helped us get back on our feet. I am not very good at these things, or telling our story but I hope whoever reads this gets the hope and courage to reach out for help, because we all need it. There really are people out there who care and are willing and wanting to help.

FPWC Campus Update

The new Family Promise of Warren County shelter home is nearly finished!! As I write this, the final inspections are due to be completed this week. If they pass, then Warren County will assign the Certificate of Occupancy. This is an exciting time for certain!

What are the next steps? Well, the first step is for the staff to move in. This will mean that the office space needs to be cleaned after years-long renovation. The state-of-the-art security system will need to be fully functional. The phones will need to be transferred. The the staff will finish boxing up our current offices and get moved to our new home.

All of this we hope will occur before the end of 2023. What a great way to begin the new year!!... But then what happens??

Well, we will need to train all our volunteers before they begin to provide meals, fellowship and overnight support at the new facility. This very important step will begin in January. All volunteers will learn every aspect of our new surroundings. The meal volunteers will learn about our new kitchen; how to work the appliances, where to store the food and where the dinnerware is located.

The fellowship volunteers will learn where to locate supplies, playroom rules and all about our playground. The overnight volunteers will learn about their roles and have the opportunity to see their sleeping room, which is far more than what they were accustomed to – a mattress on the floor! All volunteers will learn the health and safety aspects of the

new building with the primary goal of their comfort as they provide the love and hospitality for which they are famous.

Training will be in waves and will occur approximately 4 weeks prior to your hosting week. We would very much like to train at least your key volunteer staff and if possible,

all the volunteers for the upcoming host week. We are so excited to welcome our families to this place that will allow both families and volunteers to be relational once again. We are excited to share this building that will bring dignity to our families as well as a chance to find housing success and self-sufficiency. And mostly, we are excited to see the smiles on the faces of the children – which we have all dearly missed.

The future is bright, and the next chapter is about to begin. Thank you for your patience as we endeavor to provide the safest and most up to date facility for all.

Lastly, I would be remiss if I did not take this opportunity to share my sincere thanks. First to the Lebanon Presbyterian Church community. For 25 years, you have provided our current offices and day center. We have many beautiful memories that were formed in our Warren Street Day Center and our Cherry Street offices. LPC is in large part the reason for our success, and we are ever grateful.

I also want to thank our dear volunteers. If you painted, laid the flooring, did landscaping or as our Board members Todd Rockstroh and Tom Ludeke did, spent countless hours planning and working, please know that without this help, none of our wishes and dreams would have become this reality. Because of you, families now will have a safe and dignified place to stay, make memories and become housed and successful.

The evening began with Linda Rabolt, Executive Director, thanking the attendees and giving a brief history of Family Promise. Nelson Kennedy, this year’s Park Gast Award recipient, shared with Linda that it was the best night of his life.

Try It, You'll Like It Initiative

Ok, I know that I am dating myself here, but let's go with it...for now. In 1972, Alka Seltzer put out a commercial about a man in a restaurant whose waiter encouraged him to taste an entree... "Try It, You'll Like It" he said...The customer tried it and with the help of Alka Seltzer he liked it!

Family Promise of Warren County is sharing our new initiative to encourage congregations, business, organizations, clubs and the like to volunteer their time at our new facility by providing the evening meal, fellowship with our families and staying overnight.

How will "Try it, You'll Like It" work? Well, say your bowling team wants to spend time with our families in shelter but is a little concerned about how this will work and cannot commit to a week. A member of the team will call the office and we will hook you up with one of our seasoned Ambassadors. You will choose a night that is already connected to our Casseroles of Hope week; meaning you don't even have to supply the evening meal, just the sides and desserts. This is great for folks who work during the day.

The Ambassador will be in touch with you a couple of weeks before your hosting night. They will share a little about the families that you will serve and will be with you, side by side, for the evening that you serve to provide support not only in the area of meals, but also with time with the families. This can be a craft, playing on the playground, or in the play room or just spending time chatting.

The Ambassador will also be support as two of your team spend overnight in a fully equipped bedroom with all the amenities. If by chance a family knocks on the door for Tylenol for a sick child, you would supply that and go back to sleep. In the morning, you have a private bath to shower and get on with your day.

"Try It, You'll Like It" provides new volunteers with all the information and support to make their first volunteer experience with our families a success for all. I do believe that you will like it enough that you will want to come back again and again.
